### SATURDAY JUNE 9

- 11 AM – Registration and Sign-in begin at Army Reserve Rd. & Charwell Point Rd.
- 12 PM – BioBlitz begins, walks with experts, beginning with Butterflies & Dragonflies (David Bree)
- 2:00 PM – Amphibians, reptiles, ecology and more (Kari and Ewa)
- 3:30 PM – Pond study at Lighthall Rd. Ducks Unlimited Dam (Les, Wally, Abby)
- 5 PM – 6:30 PM – Dinner at the Base Camp
- 7 PM – Evening Birds – walk leaves from Base Camp (Peter Fuller: PEptBO)
- 8:30 PM – Marsh Monitoring (Lighthall Marsh)
- 9:30 PM - Moth Study begins
- 9:30 PM – Base Camp closes for the day (moth study continues until 11 PM)

### SUNDAY JUNE 10

- 8 AM – Base Camp opens – observe moths from the night survey
- 8 AM – Morning Birds – walk leaves from Base Camp (Katie Thomas)
- 9:30 AM – Plant and Amphibian walks (Dale Kristensen and Kari Gunson)
- 11:30 AM – Results of Gull Pond study at Base Camp
- 12 PM – BioBlitz ends followed by BBQ lunch and report of species

### WHAT TO BRING

1. Clothing: long pants and close-toed footwear (to protect against ticks and poison ivy)
2. Sun protection: sunscreen, hat and water (bring a refillable container – water is available at Base Camp)
3. Optional: rain gear (boots and jacket) – activities continue rain or shine and there can be wet areas if it has rained recently
4. Snacks (be sure to pack out all garbage)
5. Camera, binoculars, magnifying glass, notebook, pencil, field guides, butterfly net

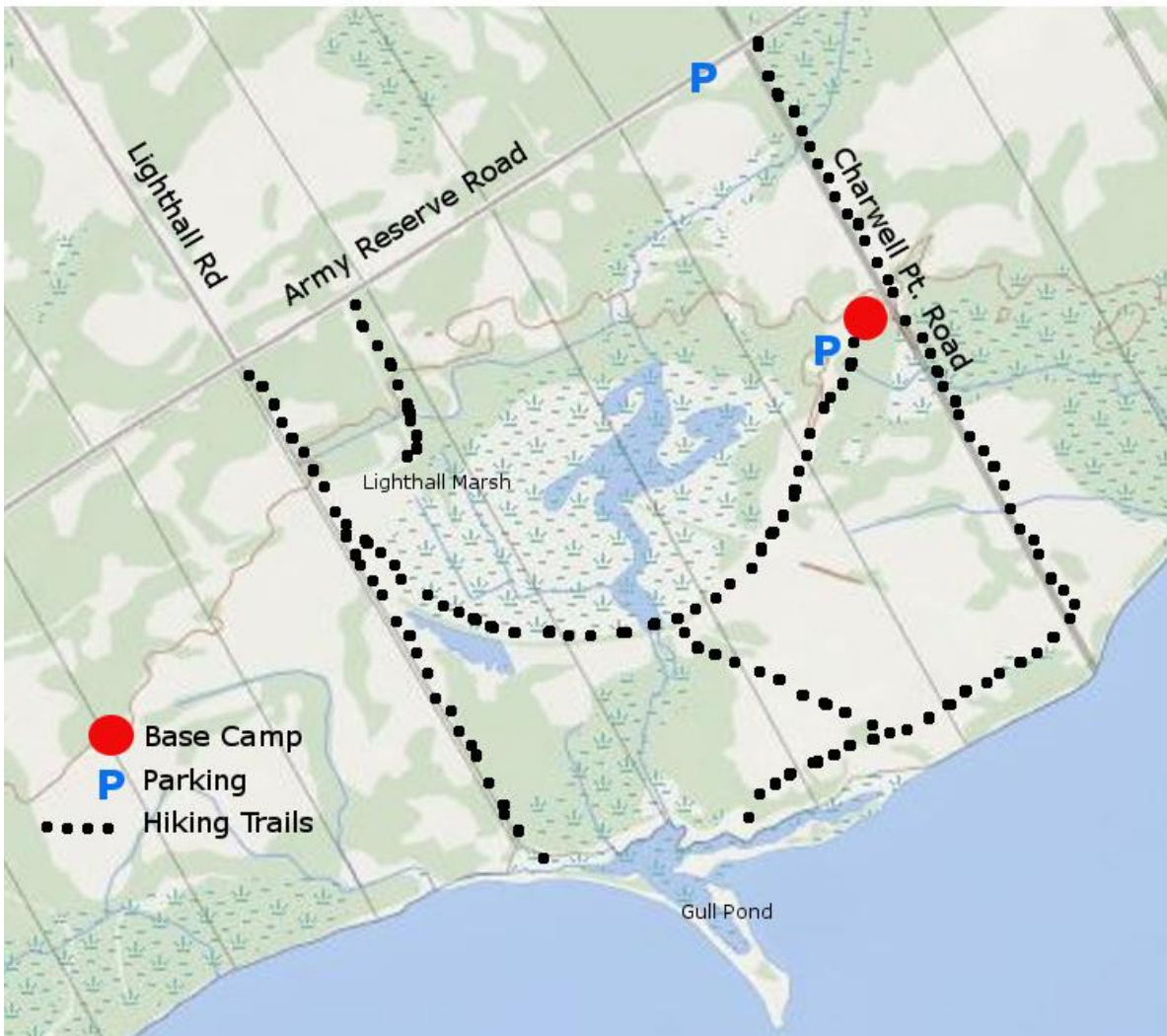
### SAFETY

1. Black-legged Ticks (which may carry Lyme disease) are present in Prince Edward County. Wear long pants and do a check after activities. More information on Ticks and Lyme disease can be found at [www.ontario.ca/page/lyme-disease](http://www.ontario.ca/page/lyme-disease)
  2. Poison Ivy is present in the area

## MAP and PARKING



Army Reserve Rd is gravel and drivable by all vehicles.

Charwell Pt. Rd is a rough unmaintained gravel road and can be driven on slowly (but it often has large puddles). Participants may wish to park on Army Reserve and walk 400m to the Base Camp

### **DIRECTIONS:**

From Cherry Valley:

County Rd. 10 south to County Rd. 24. South on 24 to Lighthall Rd. South on Lighthall Rd. to Army Reserve Rd. East on Army Reserve to Charwell Point Rd.

From South Bay area:

County Rd. 10 to Royal Rd. West on Royal Rd. to Dainard Rd. South on Dainard to Army Reserve Rd. West on Army Reserve Rd to Charwell Point Rd.
